## Background

1. At its meeting on 11 July, the Scrutiny Committee held a question and answer session with Essex Police and the Safer Harlow Partnership.
2. It was agreed that Councillors would consider the recommendations they wished the Committee to make.

## Issues/Proposals

3. This report is being brought to this meeting to enable the Committee to formalise any recommendations it wishes to make to the Cabinet.
4. Recommendations suggested by Councillors via email are:
  - a) The Council seeking to take proactive steps to tackle the 'hot spots' the Police identified for on-street harassment, and consideration be given to putting these locations in the public domain;
  - b) Developing additional 'softer' measures to chart progress in tackling domestic violence (i.e., in addition to conviction rates); and
  - c) Formalising agreements between relevant local authorities in supporting those who have escaped domestic violence to return to their home authority, where this is considered appropriate.
