CHAIR OF THE COUNCIL



Thank you for inviting Harlow Youth Council to the meeting. My name is Ella, and I am a Harlow Youth Councillor. Harlow Youth Council is a locally elected group of 13-to 19-year-olds who live in or attend school in Harlow. Harlow Youth Council is not affiliated to any political party. All young people can have their say, through their youth councillor, about issues that are important to them. As a group, the Youth Council represents the views and opinions of young people in the town. Following our elections earlier this year we were pleased to welcome a new cohort of young people to join Harlow Youth Council for their two-year term.

I am here to share an update on the work that Harlow Youth Council is doing. Our current priorities are chosen from the results of the Make Your Mark Consultation that is run UK wide every two years. The aim of the consultation is to find out what topics and issues are important to young people. In Harlow the top two issues were Crime and Safety & Health and Wellbeing, and these will be our focus for the next two years. Our work will include reviewing, and possibly adding to, the resources that are made available to children, young people, parents and carers via the HYC page on the council's website – these include information leaflets to help raise awareness of young people's mental health issues; environmental issues; and child exploitation.

Community safety remains a concern for the young people in Harlow and we have three Youth Councillors who represent young people at the police led Independent Advisory Group. In addition to this we also have two Youth Councillors who are part of the police stop and search panel where they view bodycam footage on stop and searches in Harlow and can provide feedback on how they think officers conducted the search.

Following a successful application to the Essex County Council Local Community Fund, Harlow Youth Council were able to offer free self-defence sessions to young people during the February half term which links to our crime and safety priority. The aim of the project was to educate young people about how to use correct techniques to protect themselves and help them to feel safe and secure when out in the community. The sessions were run by a local martial arts provider who was able teach the young people how to defend themselves should they ever find themselves in a situation that makes them feel unsafe. The sessions were held at the Safe to Go Stow Community Hub and followed by a briefing with an Essex Police Officer. This

gave the young people an opportunity to have an informal conversation about crime and safety in Harlow and discuss any underlying issues affecting young people in the community. The initiative was mainly targeted towards young people that live in The Stow area but young people from other areas also attended.

Youth Councillors are often involved in consultations and various services and organisations attend our meetings to discuss a range of topics and issues that affect young people. Youth Councillors provide feedback on behalf of Harlow young people, and we hope that our views are considered to help shape the growth and development of Harlow going forward. We were recently involved in a workshop focused on the Cultural Strategy and gave our views on the arts, culture and wellbeing in Harlow from young people's perspective. We are pleased that we have been given the opportunity to give our feedback and look forward to a visit from the team with an update on the strategy.

In order to help raise the profile of Harlow Youth Council and let young people know that we are here to listen to their views and make sure that their voices are heard, Youth Councillors take every opportunity to attend as many community events as possible. During the summer we plan to attend the Great Get Together in June and National Play Day in August.

Harlow Youth Council are planning another 'Apprentice Style' activity evening with Ward Councillors on Monday 16 June at the Latton Bush Centre. You should have received an Outlook invitation by now and we are looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible. We are keen to continue building closer working relationships with you and welcome any opportunities to work with Ward Councillors on any issues that affect young people in the Town.
